Lima's Unitarian Universalist Fellowship continues updating its service capabilities as well as enhancing its physical surroundings. Following this summer's rebuilding of the front porch enabling its use for meetings and music, we have a newly enlarged parking lot and a renovated ramp at the back of the house providing easy entrance for our handicapped visitors and members.

We are also updating our service capabilities. Our new website (uulima.org) and webmaster (dldaniels2@chorus.net) provide current services and other activity information and photographs as well as Unitarian Universalist philosophy and principles.

A recent Sunday service (Nov. 5) marked out first formal use of a newly installed, wall-mounted video system. Mr. Joe Dunkle, docent at the Allen County Museum, showed a video of Woodlawn Cemetery's beautiful roads, landscape, mausoleums and monuments, illustrating and enhancing his lively description of individuals, businesses and industries that established and grew Lima, Ohio from the 1830's.

The electronic equipment will also enable use of speakers' Power Point programs and occasional showing of national UU sermons and conferences. As a fellowship rather than a large church, we provide a variety of Sunday morning services led by visiting UU ministers, leaders of other denominations and philosophies, spokesmen about local problems and activities, and substantive talks developed by some of our individual members.
